

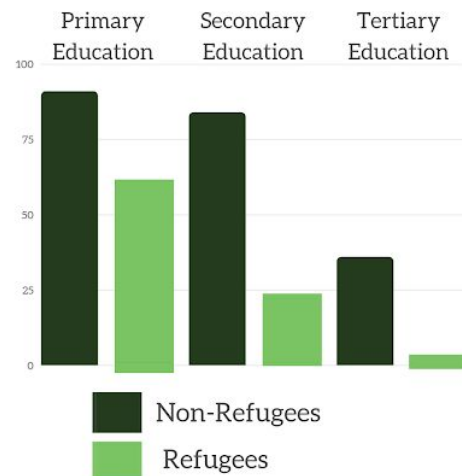


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## The Problem

## Our Solution

With our application, we use technology to give access to education to refugee children aged 9-13 years old.

## Our Program's Format

### The App

- Modules on Mathematics, English and Arabic Alphabet;
- Animated characters;
- Explanatory videos;
- Practical problems.

### NGO Partnerships

In order to reach our beneficiaries, we seek partnerships with local NGOs that serve refugees.



Currently, we have a partnership with Seeds of Humanity Greece.

## Our Impact

### Pilot Program

- **73 children directly impacted;**
- **20 families indirectly impacted;**
- **3 refugee volunteers;**
- **80 hours.**

Out of all children in our pilot program:

- 88.9% said they would recommend RefEd to a friend;
- 80% said RefEd made them change what they want to be growing up;
- 77.3% said RefEd made them want to continue learning.
