has become virtually extinct. The craft drastically declined when cheaper means of printing began to dominate the market and was further erased through devastating effects of war and conflict. The disappearance of such forms of expression means the loss of Syrian visual heritage and rich narratives of communities across the country.

Studio Kunukku will not only revive this lost craft, but aims to reinterpret revered Syrian designs, while providing livelihood opportunities for Syrian youth in Lebanon.

Marketsize - includes both individual customers, designers, brands and businesses with an interest in hand printed textiles, clothing and furniture.

Competition - other designers and textile artists creating block prints and working with local communities.

We have already initiated our go-to-market strategy in Lebanese through social media, hands-on workshops with NGOs and networking with local designers. We will enter the international market through the launch of our first streetwear collection, Barsees, in August 2021
